

SOCIAL SCIENCE MANAGEMENT COURSE.

The Labour Officer attached to the Secondary School Visiting Association of the Midlands and the Ministry of Labour, whose headquarters are at Birmingham, visited Loughborough College a few weeks ago and asked [redacted] to assist

- (a). Post-Secondary girls to obtain a short course of training in Social Science Welfare work, and, Sir, [redacted]
- (b). Post-Graduate women to obtain practical experience in the Management of Institutions.

Acting on instructions from the Principal, the Registrar wrote to all the Domestic Science Departments in the Colleges and also visited [redacted] and other educational agencies in town.

The Domestic Science Department has now decided to offer a course of practical work, and the educational authorities have agreed to do such a manner.

Suggestions for the Social Science Management Course have been

1. Duration of Course - maximum period, one year. Shorter courses could be arranged.
2. Admission - candidates who have received a course of training in Domestic Science, Sociology, etc., or others with equivalent qualifications.
3. Fees - £10. per term.
4. Residence - Students would be accommodated in registered rooms controlled by the College or, at a later date, if numbers justified the experiment, hostel accommodation might be provided.
5. Control - Students would be under the control of the Department... and under her general direction.
6. Scheme of Training - This would include:-
 - (a). Management of Residential Halls.
 - (b). Large Scale Catering.
 - (c). Management of Laundry on Productive Lines.
 - (d). Maintenance of Buildings, including cleaning and repairs.
 - (e). Health, including First Aid work, Radiography, Sun-Ray Treatment and Physical Training.
 - (f). Maintenance of Electrical Plant with particular reference to Residential Hall Requirements.
 - (g). Social Work - including organisation of entertainments for public use and general welfare of students.
 - (h). Accountancy - costs, staffing, running expenditure, and domestic book-keeping.
 - (i). Management - personal control and responsibility.
